

## Xpert Xplorer

**ROUTE** - 3.7 mile / 6km

(approx. 1 hour 15 minutes at an average walking pace)


Start from the Battle of Bannockburn Heritage Centre and head out towards the flagpole and then turn left down the path immediately before the Rotunda. Exit the Heritage Centre at the Bowling Club and continue on into Chartershall.

After Chartershall, follow the road over the motorway and as it starts to veer left, turn right onto the path at Chartershall Farm. Bikes and horses can use this path responsibly under access legislation. You are now on Tinkers' Loan.

Follow the path until you reach Gateside Road. Turn right onto Gateside Road and then continue straight on towards Bruceview Park. Go through Bruceview Park and then turn left.

Follow the road as it veers right then left and pass the shops. After a few metres, turn right onto the tree lined path and follow it through Coxet Hill.

When you come to the interpretation board, turn right and then left down the hill. Turn right onto Weaver Row and at the traffic lights turn right onto Borestone Crescent. Follow the road until you pass Thistle Park. Keep going until you come to the St Ninians Roundabout and then turn right onto Glasgow Road. Then cross Barnsdale Road and take the next right into Borestone Place (beside the United Free Church) and continue up Borestone Place until you arrive back at the Battle of Bannockburn Heritage Centre.



This leaflet is intended to help you explore Stirling Heritage Trails and enjoy Stirling as a “Walkable City”.

The trails on the map allow you to enjoy and plan circular routes. The pink core paths are additional routes to enjoy the area.
