

Xpert Xplorer

From Cambuskenneth Bridge walk forward along South Street. Turn right into the park and follow the path through the park and gate to the Hood Farm track. Turn left along the farm track to the historic Cambuskenneth Abbey. On leaving the abbey cross the cattle grid gate onto Ladysneuk Road. Here you have two options:

ROUTE 1 - 0.5 miles / 0.875km
(approx. 12 minutes at an average walking pace)


If you wish you can turn left onto South Street to get back to the bridge passing the Provost's lamp and further on the old school house.

ROUTE 2 - 0.7 miles / 1.1km
(approx. 15 minutes at an average walking pace)

We suggest you continue along Ladysneuk Road and turn left at the pub onto North Street which contains many listed 18th century cottages. Follow the road along to Ferry Orchard House and the river where you will meet up with the bridge again.

Visit Wallace Monument from here

Take time to explore the village or continue along Ladysneuk Road through the countryside and over the railway crossing. When Ladysneuk Road meets the busy Alloa Road, turn right and cross the road where a little along the road you will find a path that if you keep left will take you to the top of Abbey Craig and the Wallace Monument.

The trails on the map allow you to enjoy and plan circular routes. The pink core paths are additional routes to enjoy the area.
